Dear Applicant,

Thank you for your interest in the Bobby Bragan Youth Foundation scholarship program. We are excited that you are competing for one of our \$2,500 scholarships.

The achievement/activities section is your opportunity to let the scholarship committee know what keeps you so busy! Please be sure to furnish your complete contact information so that we may be in touch with you.

The subject of your essay should be a person who is an inspiration to you. Be sure to clearly define his or her character, attributes, ethics, values, accomplishments, or anything else as it relates to you. This is an opportunity for you to demonstrate your knowledge of world affairs, history, sports, etc. **You may choose to write about a family member or friend, but you should have compelling reasons for having chosen someone who is not in the public domain.** Your job is to justify the selection of any person by writing an essay that is meaningful, well-organized, grammatically and mechanically correct, and stylistically engaging.

This application must be completed and returned to your sponsoring teacher no later than November 16th.

THE SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Achievements/Activities Section

The Bobby Bragan Youth Foundation scholarship program is designed to recognize eighth graders who demonstrate that they are exceptional students through their scholastic achievements, athletic accomplishments, and participation in extracurricular and community activities. The scholarship committee recognizes that not all applicants are interested or involved equally in all these areas and respects these individual differences.

Essay Section

The application and essay (500-700 words) must be handwritten and legible. **Typed or computer-generated information sections and essays will not be accepted.** If more space is required applicants may attach an additional sheet of paper. **Disregard of the word limit or any suspicion or evidence of plagiarism will result in disqualification. Use of sources should be very limited, as the essay should focus not on information about the role model as much as reasons for the choice of role model.**

Sponsoring Teacher, Counselor & Principal Section

This section of the application is critical. This is your opportunity to provide additional information about the candidate that emphasizes why he or she is deserving of a BBYF scholarship. In order for this application to be considered complete, the teacher and counselor comments must be provided.

THE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The scholarship program is a competition open to eighth grade students from a total of 146 middle and junior high schools, representing Aledo, Arlington, Azle, Birdville, Burleson, Carroll, Castleberry, Crowley, Dallas, Eagle Mountain-Saginaw, Everman, Fort Worth, Grand Prairie, Grapevine-Colleyville, HEB, Joshua, Keller, Kennedale, Lake Worth, Mansfield, Northwest and White Settlement independent school districts, and three charter schools. **Two** applicants are to be selected by each participating school to represent them in the BBYF scholarship competition. These “finalists” will make up the pool from which the 34 scholarship winners will be selected. Each scholarship will be distributed after the recipient has met the following requirements:

- Graduation from high school
- Acceptance and enrollment at a college, university or technical school
- Submission of verification of enrollment to BBYF from the student’s chosen institution

The \$2,500 scholarship award will be disbursed directly to the school.
